MONSOON TREND

time, the rain in northwest India has been 17% above normal (433.1mm this season, against a 371.7mm LPA), even as showers in the east and north-east have been 18% deficient (724.5mm, as against 878.3mm). The central India and southern India IMD subdivisions received excess rains of 3% and 0%, respectively, till August 12.

The downpour over the foothills of the Himalayas, which swept away a cluster of villages in Uttarkashi last week and submerged dozens of towns, kept the central, eastern and north-eastern parts of the country from receiving much rain, said IMD officials.

Uttarakhand has received 57% excess rain this month and 12% this season. Similarly, Bihar has received 45% excess so far this August and 26% deficiency this season, Uttar Pradesh 68% and 9% and Himachal Pradesh 29% and 15%.

Most of central India however recorded large — over 60% — deficiency. In August, Madhya Pradesh recorded 68% deficiency; Chhattisgarh 62%; Rajasthan 71%; Maharashtra 63%; Odisha 65% and Gujarat 89%, among others

This may change next week, the IMD officials added.

“We are expecting that central India will start recovering from the deficiency as a low-pressure area will form over Bay of Bengal and travel towards central India,” said IMD director general M Mohapatra.

Private forecasters pointed out that the monsoon usually pauses for around 10 days in August, but that this year’s break has been longer and more unforgiving than usual for the central parts of the country.

“There is definitely a lot of variability. The monsoon trough shifted to the foothills. Along with that, there was a western disturbance, a cyclonic circulation which together created conditions for torrential rains over some parts of north India. In August we usually expect a monsoon-break period when the trough shifts north. But this was an especially prolonged period that parched Rajasthan, western Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat and others,” said Mahesh Palawat, vice president, climate and meteorology,

Skymet Weather.

“The low-pressure area building over the Bay of Bengal will now pull the eastern end of the monsoon trough to the south. It is soon likely to pass through southern Odisha and southern Chhattisgarh, among others. This will bring farmers relief,” Palawat added.

He also said the monsoon trough shifted slightly south over Delhi and Haryana last Saturday leading to extremely heavy, continuous, flooding rain over Delhi, before the trough again shifted to the foothills.

M Rajeevan, former secretary at the ministry of earth sciences, however, said this variability is normal. “Monsoon so far in August was in a typical break phase. In the break phase monsoon rains are confined to close to foothills and southeast India. This is absolutely part of monsoon variability,” he said.

SC TO HEAR DOGS CASE

spelled out welfare, staffing, record-keeping and adoption safeguards that must govern the capture and sheltering of stray animals across Delhi-NCR.

The reassignment of the case came after advocate Nanita Sharma, appearing for NGO Conference for Human Rights (India), told the CJI on Wednesday morning that the Pardiwala bench directions appeared to be in conflict with a 2024 judgment by the Supreme Court, which had barred indiscriminate killing of community dogs and required compliance with the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960, and the Animal Birth Control (ABC) Rules.

Sharma referenced the Supreme Court’s May 9, 2024 order, in which a two-judge bench closed a long-pending batch of petitions on stray dog management and the interplay between the 1960 Act, ABC Rules, and state municipal laws. This order asserted that “there cannot be any indiscriminate killings of canines” and that authorities must act in the “mandate and spirit” of prevailing legislation.

CJI Gautham responded: “But the other bench has already passed orders,” before assuring, “I will look into this.”

Hours later, the suo motu matter was listed before a new bench of three judges, also comprising justices Sandeep Mehta and NV Anjaria. A fresh petition related to the stray dog issue, filed only on Wednesday morning, will also be heard along

with the suo motu matter.

The administrative reassignment, ordered by CJI Gautham as the master of the roster vested with powers to assign and reassign cases to different benches in the Supreme Court, would allow the new bench to examine the original order. Being a larger bench, it can also stay the August 11 order or refer the issue to an even larger bench.

CJI Gautham’s latest administrative intervention came close on the heels of another such move last week in a matter decided by justices Pardiwala and Mahadevan. On Friday, the Justice Pardiwala bench reversed its unprecedented August 4 order restraining an Allahabad High Court judge from hearing criminal cases for the remainder of his tenure.

The rollback followed a letter from the CJI urging reconsideration, amid concerns that the directive had strayed into the administrative domain of the high court.

Notably, only a day earlier, while hearing an unrelated matter, CJI Gautham emphasised that the country’s top judge holds no superior judicial authority over the other 33 judges of the Supreme Court. “The CJI is not superior to other judges. He exercises the same judicial power like the other 33 judges of this court. The CJI is just the first among equals,” Justice Gautham said. This bench was hearing the Union government’s plea to recall an April 26, 2023 judgment in Ritu Chhabaria Vs Union of India, which held that an accused is entitled to default bail if the investigating agency files an incomplete charge sheet.

On August 11, justices Pardiwala and Mahadevan had directed civic bodies in Delhi, Noida, Ghaziabad and Gurugram (Faridabad added in the written order) to round up all stray dogs within eight weeks and keep them in dedicated shelters, making it clear that no captured animal should be released back on the streets.

This order, however, triggered strong reactions from animal rights groups, who argued that such sweeping measures risk causing unnecessary harm and suffering to the animals. Activists contended that the directive overlooked established animal welfare protocols, such as vaccination, sterilisation and community feeding, which they said are more effective and humane ways to manage stray

populations.

Several organisations further urged the CJI, court and government agencies to reconsider the approach.

The order released on Wednesday evening, now on the record though the Pardiwala bench will no longer hear the controversy, also made welfare protections central to the set of directives for removing stray dogs from public spaces.

The order stressed that “at no stage should these dogs be subjected to any mistreatment, cruelty or deplorable standards of care,” and added operational standards that were not set out in the oral order on August 11. Authorities have been told to ensure that: there is no overcrowding at shelters and pounds; animals are not starved; vulnerable or weak dogs be housed separately, and “timely medical care should be provided by trained veterinarians.”

On the issue of adoptions, the bench authorised authorities to consider adoption schemes but subject to strict conditions and in accordance with the Animal Welfare Board of India’s Standard Protocol for Adoption of Community Animals.

The court made it plain that any adoption that resulted in an animal being let back into public spaces would be impermissible.

EAM-WANG, LAVROV

(SCO) Summit, they said.

A meeting between Wang and Jaishankar is not being ruled out, the people said. Within days of Wang’s visit, Jaishankar will travel to Moscow during August 21-23 for talks with Lavrov and to co-chair a meeting of the India-Russia Inter-Governmental Commission on Trade, Economic, Scientific, Technological and Cultural Cooperation (IRIGC-TEC), they said.

This is the main mechanism overseeing trade and economic cooperation between the two sides and the meeting will be an opportunity to discuss matters such as the impact of US President Donald Trump’s punitive tariff on India’s purchases of Russian crude, the people said.

The visits by Wang and Jaishankar are yet to be formally announced by China or India, though preparations have been underway for quite some time, the people said. Talks in the Special Representatives format resumed after Modi and President Xi Jinping met in the Rus-

sian city of Kazan on October 23 last year — two days after India and China reached an understanding on ending the military standoff on the Line of Actual Control — and agreed to revive several mechanisms to normalise bilateral ties and address the long-festering border dispute.

However, both visits have assumed greater significance in light of a downturn in India-US relations in recent weeks on trade-related issues, primarily due to Trump slapping a tariff on Indian goods and an additional penalty for Russian oil purchases.

The two Special Representatives are expected to consider confidence-building measures to bolster peace and tranquillity in the border areas and to take forward efforts aimed at seeking a mutually acceptable framework for settling the border issue, the people said. At their last meeting in December, Doval and Wang had “resolved to inject more vitality into this process”, according to an Indian readout.

There have been several signs of a thaw in India-China ties following the chill caused by the border face-off, which saw both sides amassing nearly 50,000 troops each in Ladakh sector of LAC. In April, the two sides resumed the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra to the Tibet region after a gap of five years, and this was followed by India resuming tourist visas for Chinese nationals in July.

India and China are also in advanced negotiations on resuming direct flights and trade through selected border posts, and there has been “forward movement” on restrictions imposed by China on fertiliser exports to India.

The Special Representatives are also expected to review cross-border cooperation and data-sharing on cross-border rivers. India’s concerns about China’s construction of what is set to be the world’s largest hydropower dam on the upper reaches of the Brahmaputra river too could figure in the talks, the people said. The Indian side formally raised the construction of the \$167-billion dam on Yarlung Tsangpo river in Tibet with China and called for transparency and consultations on the project.

Wang’s meetings in New Delhi will also prepare the grounds for PM Modi’s planned visit to China to participate in the SCO Summit in Tianjin on August 31 and September 1.

Modi is expected to hold a bilateral meeting with Xi on the margins of the summit, the people said.

On Wednesday, Russian foreign ministry spokesperson Alexey Fadeev confirmed Jaishankar will hold talks with Lavrov on August 21 before participating in the 26th session of the IRIGC-TEC. The trade and economic dialogue is co-chaired by Jaishankar and Russian first deputy prime minister Denis Manturov, and it was last held in New Delhi in November 2024.

The upcoming dialogue will be an opportunity for India to discuss various trade-related issues, including the current imbalance in trade and greater trade settlement in national currencies in the face of Western sanctions and tariffs, the people said.

India-Russia trade reached a record high of \$68.7 billion in FY 2024-25, though Indian exports accounted for only \$4.88 billion. India has repeatedly raised issues such as greater access to Russian markets and diversification of trade, which has been dominated by increased uptake of Russian crude in the past three years.

As part of measures to bolster rupee-ruble trade, the Reserve Bank of India on August 5 allowed authorised dealer (AD) category-1 banks to open special rupee vostro accounts for their foreign correspondent banks, and this was followed a week later by the easing of rules to allow funds in these accounts to be invested in government securities and treasury bills.

The meeting of the IRIGC-TEC will be followed by a meeting of the India-Russia Inter-Governmental Commission on Military Technical Cooperation (IRIGC-MTC), for which the Russian defence minister will travel to New Delhi, the people said. The meeting of these bodies is part of preparations for a planned visit to India by President Vladimir Putin for the annual bilateral summit later this year.
